

Local Law 93 of 2015 (Previously Local Law 6 of 2011) – Biannual Report

Pursuant to Local Law 93 of 2015, the Department of Education is required to provide reports on student discipline data (suspension data) to the City Council twice a year (October 31 and March 31). The March reporting requires citywide suspension data by month for the first half of the academic year, July through December. Per the legislation and in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act or FERPA, any value from zero (0) to five (5) has been redacted.

Data from July – December 2023, when compared to the same time period last year, July – December 2022, the data shows an increase of 0.5% in total suspensions. Principal suspensions decreased by 0.8% and superintendent suspensions increased by 5.5%.

When compared to the same period in SY18-19 total suspensions are down 14.4%. Principal suspensions decreased by 8.9% and superintendent suspensions decreased by 30.4%

In addition, pursuant to Local Law 93 of 2015, the Department of Education is required to provide the total number of EMS transports and the number of EMS transports performed because of a student’s emotional/psychological condition to City Council twice a year (October 31 and March 31). The March reporting requires EMS data disaggregated by district and by month for the first half of the school year (July to December). Per the legislation and in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act or FERPA, any value from zero (0) to five (5) has been redacted.

Data from July – December 2023, when compared to the same time period last year, July – December 2022, shows a decrease of 4.7% in total transports, while transports for emotional/psychological conditions have increased by 10.5% an increase of 32 incidents.

When compared to the same period in SY18-19 EMS transports are down 21%, and transports for emotional/psychological conditions are down 39.6%.
