Display ratings	The ratings chart on the first page of the School Quality Snapshot (and at the top of each tab) was blank for all schools due to COVID-19. Section ratings and metric ratings throughout the report were “N/A.”	The ratings will resume being displayed at the top of each tab in the School Quality Snapshot as well as on the Dashboard.
Display comparison group	The Comparison Group was omitted due to COVID-19.	Comparison Group results will be calculated for the 2022-23 school year, and city/district/borough averages will be displayed on the Snapshot. This Comparison Group Overview and Methodology document explains how comparison groups and results are created.

Addition of Seal of Civic Readiness to College and Career Prep Course Index (CCPCI)	This seal was not offered in prior years.	Students who earn the Seal of Civic Readiness will count positively toward the CCPCI metric.
