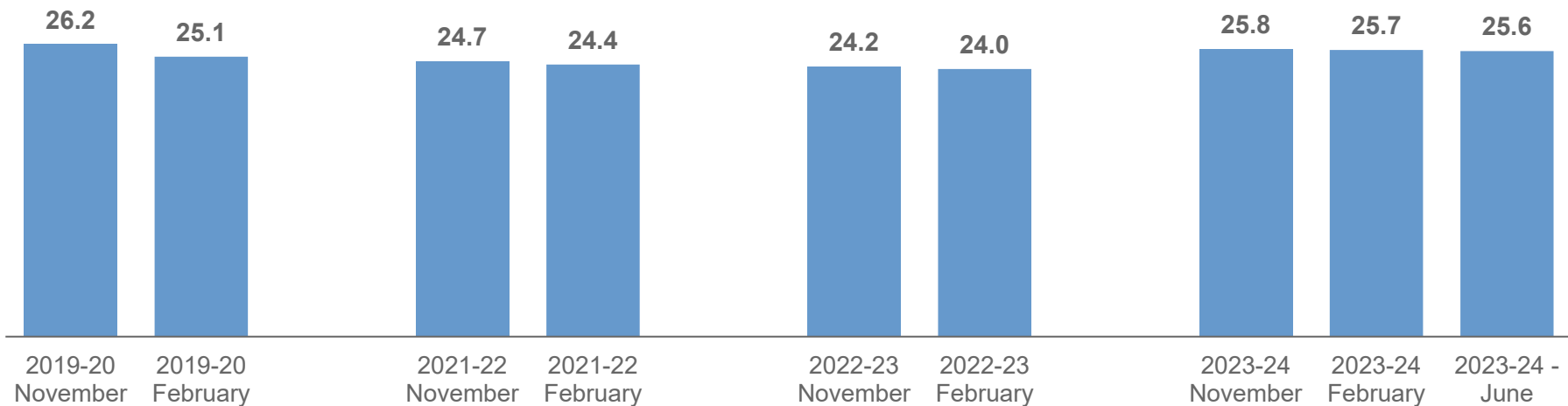

Citywide Class Size Averages

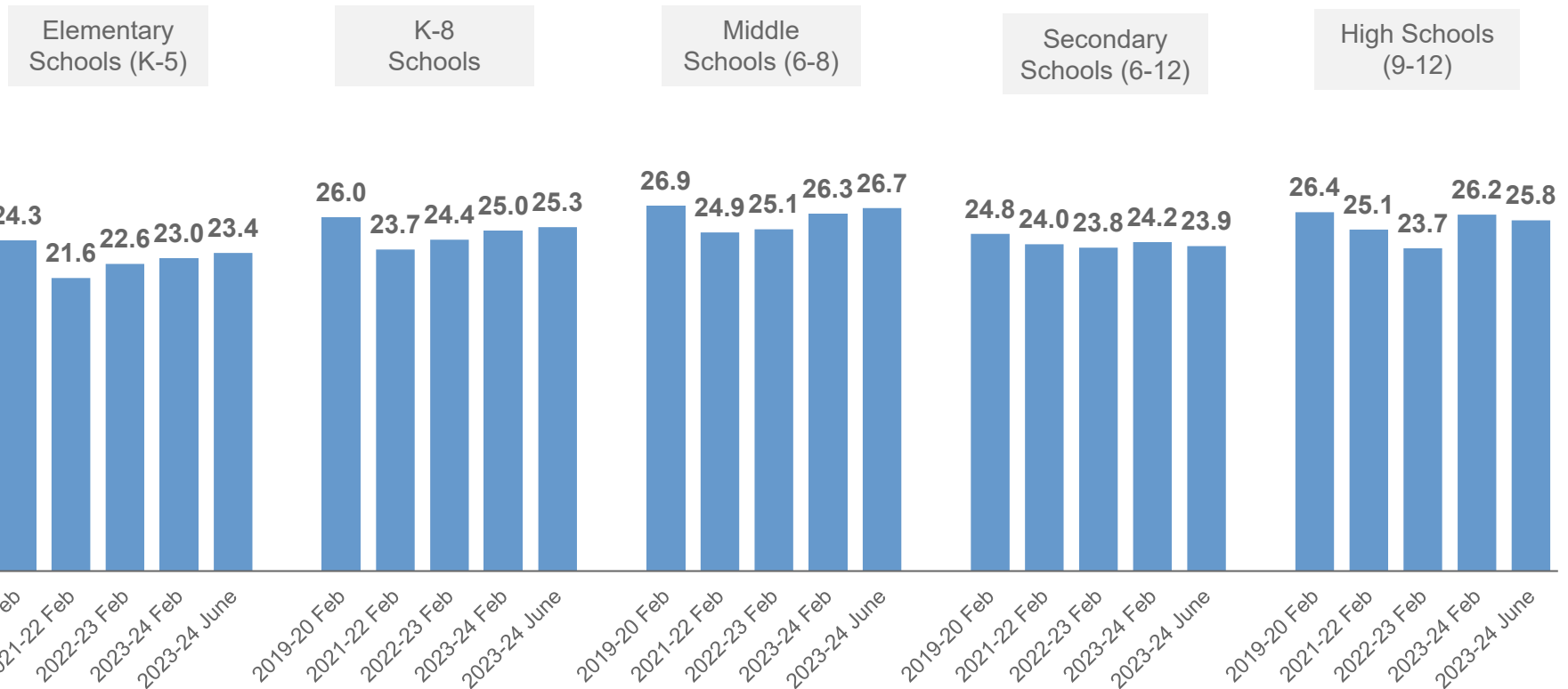
New York City Public Schools (NYCPS) previously reported on class size twice a year with a preliminary report in November and an updated report in February. Results for February reflect refreshed data from 10/31, as the November report includes long-term absences, incomplete scheduling data, and other characteristics that are updated by schools in the February report.

Starting for the 2023-24 school year, NYCPS also reports on class size a third time as of the end of the school year (6/15), reflecting class sizes in the Spring semester.



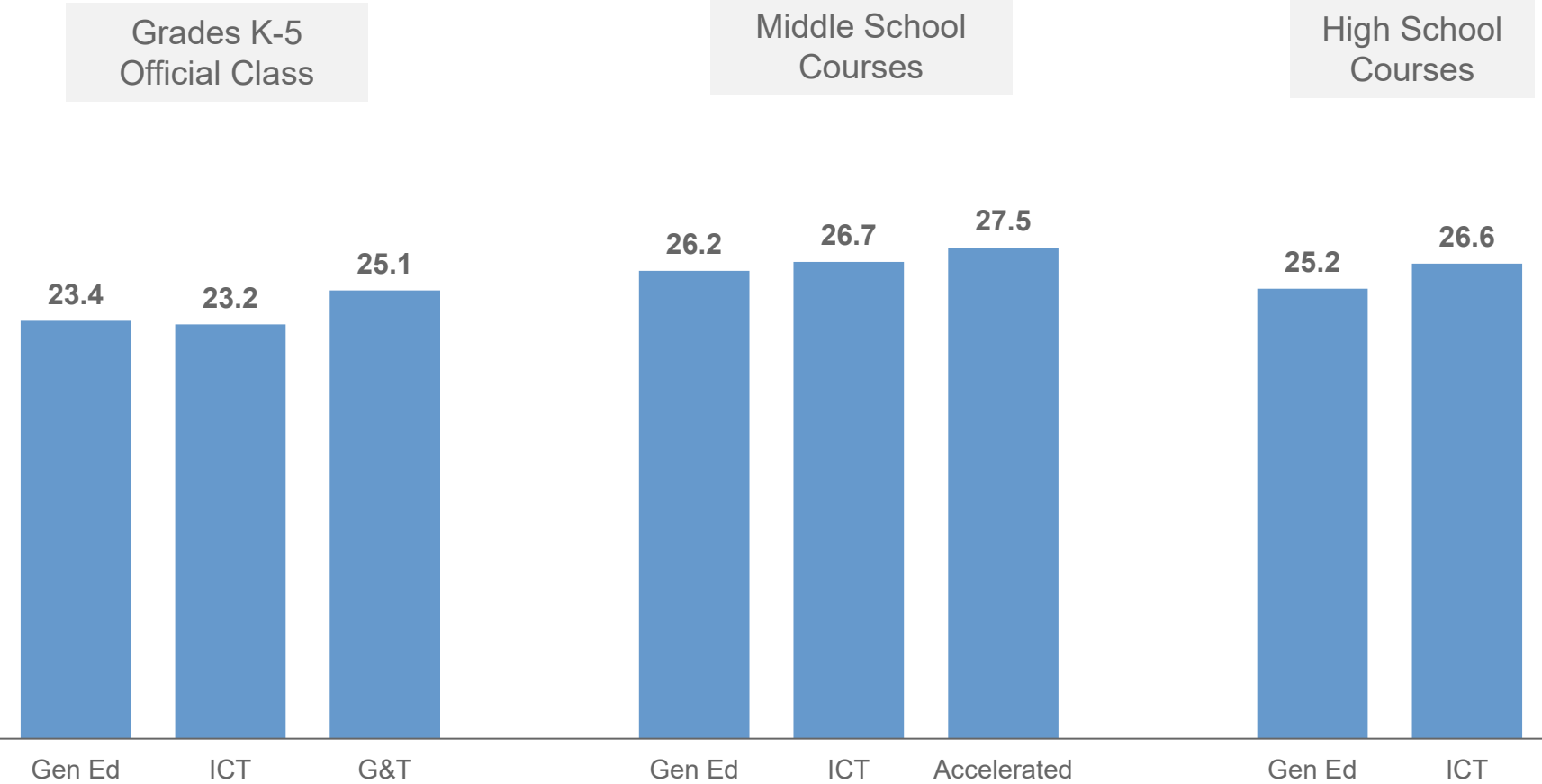
- For grades K-5, average class size is calculated by dividing the number of students as of 6/15 enrollment snapshot by the number of classes as determined by each student's official class from the Automate the Schools (ATS) system.
- For courses in grades 6-12, average class size is calculated by the number of students as of a 6/15 enrollment snapshot in the last term of the school year in each course from the STARS system as determined by students who are meeting in the same place at the same time.
- To align with the class size methodology used for the new class size law, the 2023-24 class size calculations for the City Council Report include for the first time bridge classes, non-core courses, including arts and physical education, D75 inclusion students, and shared instruction classes.** Now, grades 7-8 are only represented in the STARS scheduling data; grade 6 is included in both depending on the school's scheduling method. This slightly increases averages overall compared to prior years.

To align with the class size methodology used for the new class size law, the 2023-24 class size calculations for the City Council Report include for the first time bridge classes, non-core courses, including arts and physical education, D75 inclusion students, and shared instruction classes. June 2023-24 Average Class Size by Program Type



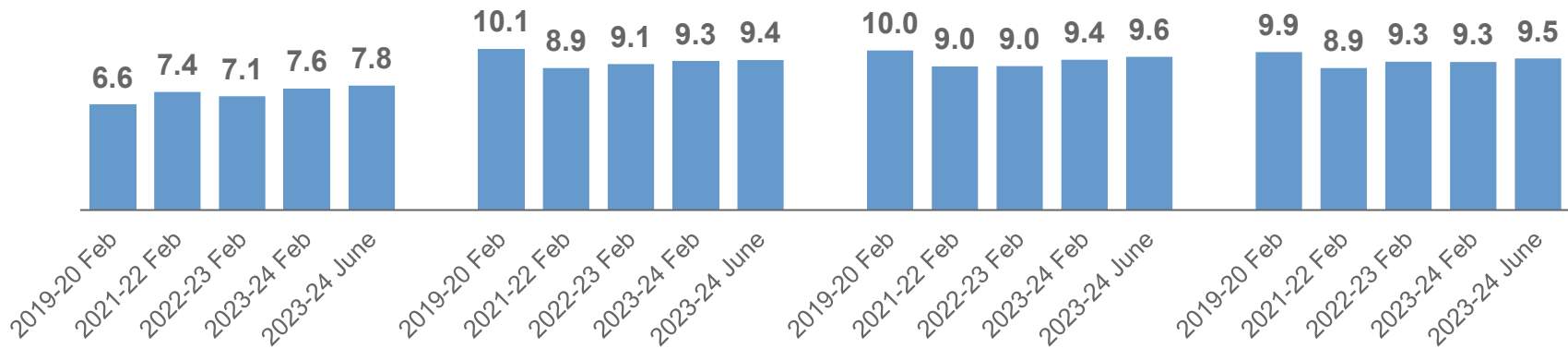
