Employment Certification for Student Loan Forgiveness

As <u>noted</u> in the September 20 edition of Principals' Digest, anyone with federal student loans who works for the government or a nonprofit—including DOE employees — is eligible for loan forgiveness via the Public Service Loan Forgiveness (PSLF) Waiver. But this opportunity is only available until **October 31, 2022**.

As part of this process, **supervisors are asked to fill out an Employment Certification Form** and send it back to the employee applying for loan forgiveness. The form looks like this:

Please note:

- You should check the applicant's' employment dates to see if they are correct or provide that information to them if they don't know it.
- You can choose any of your employees to be an "authorized official" to sign this form –
 HR directors, secretaries, office managers as long as they have access to the
 applicant's employment records.
- For "Authorized Official's Signature," you must either physically sign the form (in pen), or insert an image file of your signature – you can't use e-signature services like DocuSign.
- You can either email the signed document back to the applicant, or you can give them a "hard copy" if you want.
- Applicants must start their application by October 31, 2022 so even if you get a request after October 31st, you can still sign and return to them.
- Please keep a tally of all the Employment Certification Forms that you are signing!
