



## Guidance for Principals on Emergency Preparedness Activity on Thursday, June 6, 2024 At-Home Pivot to Remote Simulation

As you have emphasized the importance of this emergency preparedness activity to your staff, we want to provide you with some guidance around activities for the day of the activity. Since June 6 is a remote professional development day for staff and a non-attendance day for students, we have scheduled this activity in the morning and have requested voluntary participation from families.

Teachers and staff attending citywide or school-based virtual professional development will be relieved of professional development during the simulation schedule below, and the balance of the day shall be utilized for professional development. If any staff have already committed to in-person professional development on Chancellor's Conference Day, staff may participate in the professional development and do not need to participate in the simulation.

During this remote simulation, both teachers and students will log into [Teachhub](#) and access NYCPS online applications during a scheduled time in the morning. This will allow our colleagues in the Division of Instruction and Information Technology (DIIT) to review the "load" this puts on the system (the number of users on at once and how that affects our systems).

### SCHEDULE:

To effectively test our systems, grades will log-in via a staggered schedule. **It is critical that online activities take place during designated grade times so that our DIIT team can monitor activity during this simulation.**

During the simulation, participating staff and students are expected to log into [Teachhub](#) at the given start time based on their grade level as laid out below, and are expected to remain online during as well and stay on until their designated end time.

- **Grades 6–8 staff:** 8:25 - 8:55 a.m.
- **Grades 6–8 students:** May login between 8:30 - 8:45 a.m. Stay online until 8:55 a.m.
- **Grades 9–12 staff:** 8:40 - 9:10 a.m.
- **Grades 9–12 students:** May login between 8:45 - 9:00 a.m. Stay online until 9:10 a.m.
- **Grades 3-K/pre-K–5 staff:** 8:55 - 9:25 a.m.
- **Grades 3-K/pre-K–5 students:** May login between 9:00 - 9:15 a.m. Stay online until 9:25 a.m.

### PREPARATION:

- Ensure that each student and staff member has access to a working internet-enabled device
- Support students to access their student accounts and log in to the digital classroom, including resetting student passwords as needed
- Make sure teachers know that students need to log in through Teachhub
- Prepare to provide up to 25 minutes of a virtual activity

- Please make sure your community is aware of this simulation and be prepared to answer questions from your wider school community. Please also be aware that a communication will be sent out centrally informing families of this event this week.
- Notify school staff of expectations for implementing the Pivot to Remote Citywide Simulation.

Please note the Chancellor’s Conference Day is not an instructional day, and attendance should not be taken; students are not required to participate in this simulation. As a reminder, students may be joining at different points during the assigned simulation windows.
