ORGANIZATION OF STUDENT ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) EXAM RESULTS

Overview

The Student Advanced Placement (AP) Exam Results datasets are student-exam-level files containing student AP test data. Each yearly administration has its own file (e.g., 2005-06_AP). The data are stored in comma separated value files (.csv) with a separate file for each school year.

In the files, students have multiple records depending on how many AP tests they took during each school year. Each student has a unique student identification number, which can be linked across years.

Charter school students are not included

In the files, students have multiple records depending on how many AP tests they took during each school year. The College Board is responsible for producing and scoring all AP tests. Results on NYC students are then shared with the DOE on a student level. These files are then matched against DOE files and students are matched on Name and DOB. For 2013, College Board collected OSIS, so there is a greater match rate. ONLY MATCHED STUDENTS WITH AN OSIS ID ARE INCLUDED IN THE FILES — THEY WILL NOT MATCH PUBLICLY REPORTED AGGREGATES PROVIDED BY COLLEGE BOARD.

Pertinent information about the Advanced Placement (AP) test

AP tests are administered at the end of the school year (usually in May) to students who have attended AP-level/-assigned courses. AP courses, as well as tests, are designed to be comparable to introductory, college-level courses. On some occasions and depending on the post-secondary institution a student may attend, course credit or core-curriculum exemptions can be offered to students scoring 4 or 5 on an AP test. Please note that AP tests are not required of NYC students.
