

2025-26 STUDENT PERCEPTION SURVEY

ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

Teacher Eligibility:

Grades 6–12 teachers are eligible to participate in the Student Perception Survey if they have at least 10 total students.

For teachers who teach students less than five days per week, schools should aim to survey students who have had **at least 10 class meetings** with the teacher.

- ✓ For schools administering to **ONE** class per teacher:
Teachers of grades 6-12 must have at least 10 students. If the class has fewer than 10 students, the survey can be administered for that teacher in up to two classes to meet the 10-student minimum.
- ✓ For schools administering to **TWO** classes per teacher:
Teachers of grades 6-12 must have at least 10 students present across the two classes. If this minimum is not met, the survey can be administered for that teacher in additional class periods to meet the 10-student minimum.

For Teachers at D75 schools:

- ✓ Only teachers of students in grades 6-12 who are in a 12:1:1 class *and* who take standardized assessments. SETSS, 6:1:1, Push-In, Pull-Out, and AIS teachers if they teach at least 10 students. Teachers with students who take alternative assessments do **not** have to participate in the Student Perception Survey.

Students are eligible if:

- ✓ They are currently enrolled in grades 6-12. (Include students with IEPs in ICT or 12:1:1 classrooms)
- ✓ They take standardized assessments.
- ✓ They are taught by the teacher being surveyed for at least four weeks prior to survey administration.
- ✓ Students in D75 only if they...
 - Take standardized assessments and are in a class being surveyed
 - Are in inclusion classes or 12:1:1 classes
 - Have had at least 10 class meetings with the teacher being surveyed

Note: An effort should be made to survey students who have had at least 10 class meetings with a teacher who teaches them less than five days per week.
