

2025-26 Student Perception Survey Quick Reference Guide for Survey Coordinators

KEY INFORMATION

New York City Public Schools partners with Panorama Education to offer the Student Perception Survey, a research-based, anonymous student survey used across the country to provide teachers with students' feedback about their classroom experiences. The survey is administered for formative purposes, and is not administered as a part of Advance, New York City's system for teacher development and evaluation.

- Student Perception Survey materials will arrive via email the week of November 24, 2025.
- Student Perception Survey administration begins **December 8, 2025**.
- All surveys must be completed online by January 16, 2026.
- In planning for this year's Student Perception Survey, keep in mind that the winter recess is scheduled from December 24 January 2. If your school does not plan to complete survey administration prior to the winter recess, please ensure that any survey materials that were printed for teachers and proctors are stored in a secure location to prevent items from being misplaced or discarded. In addition, ensure that you can access the email with survey materials easily and that you can return to it for additional printing and distribution of materials.

SURVEY COORDINATOR RESPONSIBILITES

- Be sure to read your weekly Student Perception Survey emails they have detailed information about survey administration materials and dates for your school.
- Let your principal and school staff know when survey codes are arriving and when surveys must be administered.
- Ensure that survey materials are received by your school.
- Plan, coordinate, and oversee the administration of the survey.
- Guide your school in conducting the survey process ethically. Be vigilant of any school
 communications or actions that might interfere with the confidentiality or honesty of survey
 participation.

SURVEY ELIGIBILITY

Eligible teachers: For schools administering to ONE class per teacher:

Must have at least 10 students present in the class. If the class has fewer than 10 students, the survey can be administered for that teacher in up to two classes to meet the 10-student minimum. For schools administering TWO classes per teacher: Must have at least 10 students present across the two classes. If this minimum is not met, the survey can be administered for that teacher in additional class periods to meet the 10-student minimum.

For D75 Teachers:

- SETSS, 6:1:1, Push-In, Pull-Out, and AIS teachers if they teach 10 or more eligible students across two class periods.
- For District 75, teachers of students in grades 6-12 who are in a 12:1:1 class and who take standardized assessments.

Eligible students:

- Currently enrolled students in grades 6-12 and who take standardized assessments.
 - o Includes students with IEPs in ICT or 12:1:1 classrooms
- Students must be taught by the teacher for at least 4 weeks prior to administration.

For D75 Students:

- Take standardized assessments and are in a class being surveyed
- Are in inclusion classes or 12:1:1 classes
- Have had at least 10 class meetings with the teacher being surveyed
